Laura Joella, a second generation conductor, is the Director of Orchestral Studies and the Music Director/Conductor of the University Symphony Orchestra at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Florida. The South Florida Sun-Sentinel praised her as having "a superbly idiomatic touch" and for "drawing tremendously energized rhythmic kick and verve" from FAU's students. She has been

on the faculty at FAU since May of 2005. Joella is also the Music Director/Conductor of New England Music Camp's Concert Orchestra in Sidney, Maine and the Associate Conductor of the Florida Youth Orchestra's Symphony Orchestra in Hollywood, Florida. Her previous posts include Music Director/Conductor of the Mason Orchestral Society in Mason, Michigan including both the Community Orchestra and the Youth Symphony; Conductor for the Michigan State University Concert Orchestra; and Assistant Instructor of Strings at Michigan State University School of Music in East Lansing, Michigan.

As a guest conductor, she has appeared with the Naples Philharmonic Orchestra in Naples, Florida; the Wind Symphony of Florida; the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association District 8 Orchestra Festival; the Portland Orchestral Society in Michigan; the Michigan State University Symphony and Philharmonic Orchestras; and the Lake Orion School District Orchestra Festival in Michigan.

Dr. Joella received both her Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in Orchestral Conducting from Michigan State University. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Music Performance with a dual concentration in Double Bass and Saxophone, as well as her Bachelor of Science in Music Education, from Lebanon Valley College in Annville, Pennsylvania. She was a participating conductor at the Naples Philharmonic Conductor's Institute. She studied and conducted at the Conductor's Institute at Spoleto USA, and the Conductor's Institute of South Carolina. Joella has studied conducting with Jorge Mester; Professor Leon Gregorian and Dr. Raphael Jimenez at Michigan State University; and with Donald Portnoy, Paul Vermel, Kate Tamarkin, Peter Jaffe, and Samuel Jones at the Conductor's Institute of South Carolina.



Jihong Park began playing piano at the age of seven. A self-taught beginner, he started formal training at the age of 17 with his piano teacher in Korea, and in 1995, studied for his Bachclor's in Piano Performance at Chung-ang University in Seoul, Korea. While attending Chung-ang University, Jihong developed an interest in performing contemporary music, subsequently recording his debut album at the Chung-ang Contemporary Music

Festival in Seoul was released by a major recording company in Korea, Jigu Records. Jihong won second-place in numerous Korean piano competitions, including the Korean Youth Piano Competition, the Changwon University Piano Competition, and the Chon-nam Piano Competition, and received a full undergraduate scholarship for piano performance. He has performed in multiple national and international venues including Kyungnam Art Center in Korea, and the Steinway Gallery and Clarke Recital Hall in Miami, Florida. He is currently a graduate assistant as well as a Master of Arts in Music student at Florida Atlantic University. He has been studying piano with Judith Burganger since 2010.



John Provenzano began his clarinet studies at age 11, becoming a frequently featured performer throughout his high school years in both jazz and classical styles and groups. After graduation, he continued his musical pursuits at Palm Beach State College under the direction of Professor David Gibble, where he participated in the Tuesday Night Jazz Band and the PBSC Wind Band. After two years he made his way to Florida Atlantic University as a commercial music student, playing in

such groups as the FAU Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, and Orchestra. Provenzano has played in groups that have traveled from France to Canada, from the Bahamas to Martinique. His band Sir Veza is currently signed to FAU's Hoot/Wisdom record label. He currently studies clarinet with Paul Green.



Edgar M. Abréu, tenor, currently resides in south Florida. Mr. Abreu is a senior vocal performance major at Florida Atlantic University and studies with Patricia Fleitas. Mr. Abreu was the tenor soloist for Florida Atlantic University's annual *Messiah* performance in 2009 and 2010. Also in 2010, Mr. Abreu sang the role of *Don Ottavio* at Florida Atlantic University with the opera scenes course directed by Bass-Baritone Dean

Peterson. Mr. Abreu was recently selected as one of three winners of Florida Atlantic University's Aria and Concerto Competition. He will be performing with the Florida Atlantic University Symphony Orchestra in February 2011. Following graduation, Mr. Abreu plans to continue his studies in hopes of pursuing a career as an opera singer.
