FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY

Florida Atlantic University, a member of the State University System of Florida, was established in 1961 and opened its doors to students in 1964. In addition to its 850-acre campus in Boca Raton, FAU has campuses in Fort Lauderdale, Davie, Palm Beach Gardens and Fort Pierce.

The University's nine colleges - the Schmidt College of Arts and Humanities, and the Colleges of Business, Education, Engineering, Liberal Arts, Nursing, Science, Social Science, and Urban and Public Affairs - offer 52 bachelor's, 41 master's, 3 specialist's, 1 associate's, and 14 doctoral degrees. As of December 1993, the University had awarded 55,884 degrees, serving more than 130,000 individuals through its instructional programs.

In December 1967, Florida Atlantic University was elected to regular membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, at which time the Commission on Higher Education of that Association granted full accreditation to all of the University's programs. In accordance with Association regulations, this accreditation was reaffirmed in 1973, 1983, and again in 1993.

In the fall of 1993, the University had 16,500 students and 1,000 faculty members.

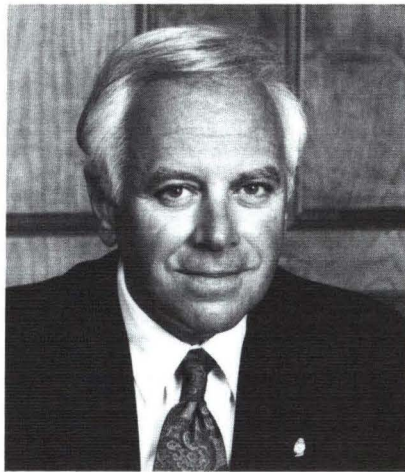

Dr. Anthony James Catanese



Dr. Anthony James Catanese joined FAU as the University's fourth President in January, 1990. Dr. Catanese was previously the Dean of the College of Architecture at the University of Florida; Professor and Director of the Center for Planning and Development at the Georgia Institute of Technology; Provost of Pratt Institute in New York City; Dean of the School of Architecture and Urban Planning at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee; and Associate Dean of the School of Engineering and Environmental Design and James A. Ryder Professor at the University of Miami. Dr. Catanese also was a Senior Fulbright Professor at the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogota, Colombia.

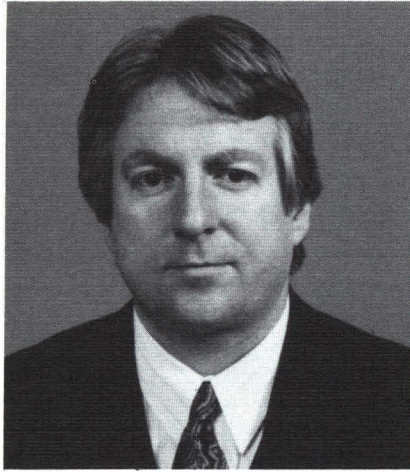
Dr. Catanese previously maintained a private practice in design, planning, and development. His consulting contracts numbered over fifty clients, including coastal zone planning and development in Hawaii and native land claims in Alaska. As a developer, he built several projects for the single family and multi-family market in the Atlanta region.

Dr. Catanese has been a public servant as well. He was appointed by President Jimmy Carter to the National Urban Policy Task Force. He served as chairman of the Milwaukee City Plan Board and the Gainesville City Plan Board. Dr. Catanese was president of the Park West Development Corporation, a not-for-profit organization that planned and developed a major area in Milwaukee. He is currently a member of the Board of the Environmental Education Foundation of Florida, appointed by the Governor. He has also served on the Presidents Commission of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

Dr. Catanese received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in Planning and Land Economics; the Master's Degree in Planning and Public Administration from New York University; and the Bachelor's Degree in Planning and Civil Engineering from Rutgers University. He has done advanced studies in real estate finance, computers, and transportation.

A prolific writer, Dr. Catanese has authored eleven books, eighteen chapters in books, over sixty-five articles in journals, and thirty-five research monographs. Two of his books, Planners and Politics: Impossible Dreams and Urban Planning, have been best sellers in their fields.

Dr. Robert M. Orr, Jr.**



Robert M. Orr, Jr. has had a career spanning the corporate world, academia and government. Currently Director of Government Relations for Japan at Nippon Motorola, Ltd., he was formerly Director of the Institute for Pacific Rim Studies and Associate Professor of Political Science at Temple University's Japan campus. He has also served as Director of the Kyoto Center for Japanese Studies and the Stanford Center for Technology and Innovation at the Stanford Japan Center from 1990 to 1992.

In addition to a B.A. in History from Florida Atlantic University (cum laude) and a Master's degree in Government from Georgetown University, he holds a Ph.D. in political science from the University of Tokyo.

Prior to his academic career, Dr. Orr was an interpreter for the International Olympic Committee during the 1972 Munich Olympics. In addition, he served as Legislative Assistant to Congressman Paul G. Rogers (D-FL), on the staff of the U.S. House of Representatives Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control and later on the Foreign Affairs Committee's Subcommittee on Asia and Pacific Affairs. From 1981 to 1983, he was Special Assistant to the Assistant Administrator for Asia in the U.S. Agency for International Development. More recently he has acted as an advisor on Asia policy to President Bill Clinton.

Fluent in both German and Japanese, Dr. Orr has resided in Japan since 1983. In addition to his faculty responsibilities, he has served as an aide to the Parliamentary Vice Minister for Foreign Affairs in the Japanese Diet and as a staff consultant to the Upper House Budget Committee, the first non-Japanese to be appointed to a Parliamentary committee staff. Dr. Orr is an affiliate of the Center for Japanese Studies at the University of Hawaii and a frequent visiting fellow at the East-West Center in Honolulu. He was appointed by U.S. Ambassador to Japan, Michael Armacost, to serve as a commissioner on the Japan-United States Education Commission (Fulbright Program) from 1991 to 1993.

Dr. Orr has published numerous academic and journalistic articles on Japanese politics and foreign policy. He is a regular columnist for Tokyo Business Today and his book [The Emergence of Japan's Foreign Aid Power](#) (New York: Columbia University Press, 1990) won the 1991 Masayoshi Ohira Foundation prize for best book on the Pacific Region. His latest book, co-edited with Bruce Koppel, is [Japan's Foreign Aid: Power and Policy in a New Era](#) published by Westview in 1993.

He makes his home in Yokohama with his wife, Mitsuko.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Lending color to the pageantry of the Academic Commencement are the academic robes and hoods worn by the faculty and delegates. This regalia reaches back into the medieval ages when it served a functional as well as an ornamental role, separating the learned men from other groups and offering warmth and protection.

In late nineteenth century America, a conference was held by representatives of colleges and universities to bring more order and system to the custom of academic dress. Since then, there have been periodic conferences to revise or reconfirm existing practices.

Essentially, holders of the bachelor's degree wear black robes unadorned. Holders of the master's degree wear hoods which are lined with the colors of the college conferring the degree and trimmed with the color representing the subject in which the degree was earned. The doctoral robe is adorned with velvet and also is worn with the hood suitably ornamented.

Holders of degrees from foreign universities or religious orders wear the entire academic costumes as decreed by the conferring institution.

The History of the Mace

The mace, generally made of wood and clad in metal, was used as a weapon during the Middle Ages. Later, as more powerful military arms were developed, the mace became a symbol of authority.

During the 12th century, guards of the English and French kings were the first to bear ceremonial maces. The tradition grew and by the end of the 16th century, the mace was used by officials in cities and towns throughout England. Today, the ceremonial mace is carried in the British Houses of Parliament, before ecclesiastical dignitaries, and in university convocations.

The Florida Atlantic University mace carried in today's commencement procession was designed and handcrafted by FAU art professor William Latimer and is made of mahogany and silver. The carved staff, encircled with silver rings, is topped by a silver owl with outspread wings. The design signifies the dignity, determination and wisdom of FAU's mascot, the burrowing owl.

The flags on display above the platform represent many of the nations from which FAU students come. The original collection was presented to the University by Mrs. Leslie A. Wagner and her late husband. Additional flags have been donated by a number of individuals and organizations.

President Catanese cordially invites all the graduates and their guests to a reception immediately following the Commencement Exercises in the Breezeway of the Field House, just south of the gymnasium.

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHT

The College of Liberal Arts

From make-do beginnings in borrowed and shared space to the 13-building prefabricated Modular Centre it currently occupies, Florida Atlantic University's Davie-based College of Liberal Arts has been on a steady growth curve since its creation in 1990. Faculty and students are eagerly poised to move into the College's first permanent building, which is being readied for summer 1994 occupancy. The \$12 million, 110,000-square-foot structure, the largest ever built on any FAU campus, cannot open soon enough for the burgeoning College. Completing its fourth year of operation on its campus adjoining Broward Community College's Central Campus, the College of Liberal Arts has experienced explosive growth since welcoming its pioneer group of students. In just four years the College's enrollment has increased by a dramatic 821 percent from 376 to 3,462. During the same period, the number of credit hours taken in the College has grown by 228 percent.

Under the guidance of its first dean, Dr. Mary G. McBride, who is now vice president for FAU's Broward campuses, the College crafted a mission to academically challenging work aimed at increasing students' knowledge, developing their powers of judgment, analysis and problem-solving, and preparing them for employment or graduate-level study. Its diversified curriculum includes complete bachelor's degrees in biology, economics, English, geography, graphic arts, history, music, political science psychology, sociology, secondary English education, and liberal studies, a unique interdisciplinary degree program that gives qualified students the opportunity to design their own majors. Such diversity is made possible by the fact that the College's 27-member faculty is, by design, drawn from the arts and humanities, the social sciences and the sciences. With an average 16-to-1 student-to-faculty ratio, the College offers students the benefit of small class sizes taught by dedicated faculty members whose commitment goes beyond the classroom setting to include careful attention to advisement. All FAU degree programs are coordinated with the freshman- and sophomore-level courses of Broward Community College, enabling students to progress smoothly through four years of higher education without leaving Broward County.

The College of Liberal Arts also welcomes eligible BCC students who have completed 40 credit hours. Working closely with the BCC Honors Institute, the College's Honors Program permits the enrollment of lower division honor students in FAU courses.

The Teacher Education Alliance, an innovative program linking FAU and BCC with the Broward Public School System, is also headquartered on the Davie campus as part of the College of Liberal Arts and the College of Education. Begun in the fall of 1992, the Teacher Education Alliance is a five-year experimental program designed to "home grow" Broward County teachers. Its goal is to identify future teachers while they are still in high school and to inspire them, through hands-on experiences, to commit themselves to teaching careers. Upon graduating from FAU, the students are guaranteed jobs as public school teachers in Broward County.

Ground was recently broken for a \$15 million joint-use FAU/BCC library that will triple current library resources at Davie. When complete in 1996, the state-of-the-art library will provide access to extensive science, business, arts and humanities collections, as well as computerized linkage with the S. E. Wimberly Library on FAU's Boca Raton campus. The holdings of other universities' libraries and out-of-state research facilities also will be accessible to users of the new library.

Additional expansion plans for the College of Liberal Arts include a second classroom/office building to help accommodate future growth.
